REMEMBER: When in doubt, throw it out!

Things to consider doing:

- Temporarily close your business.
- Contact the McDonough County Health Department for assistance. Inspections will be performed during boil orders.
- Serve a limited menu.
- Substitute canned or bottled beverages for machine dispensed beverages.
- Use disposable dishware.

Things that must be done

- Provide a safe potable water supply. This can be an alternate source of water and ice brought in (bottled water, commercially bagged ice) or water that has been boiled vigorously for 5 minutes.
- Proper hand washing! Hand sanitizer has never been an accepted alternative to proper hand washing. Buckets of soapy water and rinse water are NOT APPROVED for emergency hand washing. In order to operate, you must provide warm potable water in a container with a non-self closing spigot. This will allow both hands to be available for hand washing and in turn provide effective cleaning. As always, soap & paper towels are required, and the wastewater must drain into a sink. Hand washing will use a lot of water.
- Dish washing: If using a dish washing machine, all dishes must also be sanitized in the 3rd compartment of your 3 compartment sink for at least 1 minute with potable water (bottled or boiled) and sanitizer at the recommended ppm after going through the machine.
- Discontinue use of all equipment plumbed directly into the water system (direct feed coffee machines, ice machines, post-mix soda machines, dipper wells, produce misters, etc.).
- Once the boil order is lifted,
 - Run all water lines for **one minute** to flush contaminated water from system. This includes each fill point for post-mix soda and beverage machines.
 - Clean and sanitize all fixtures, sinks and equipment connected to water lines.
 - □ Run your dishwasher empty through **three complete cycles** to flush the water lines and assure that the dishwasher is cleaned internally before using it.
 - Discard all ice in ice machines; clean and sanitize the interior surfaces; (1 tablespoon of bleach per 1 gallon of potable water) run the ice through 3 cycles; and discard ice with each cycle.
 - Replace all ice machine filters and beverage dispenser filters and flush all water lines for 10 -15 minutes.
